Adani takes bankers on Gujarat trip as he looks to sell 15,000 crore debt

billionaire Gautam Adani's conglomerate took a group of local bond arrangers on a site visit last week, people familiar with the matter said, after gearing up to sell up to \$1.8 billion worth of debt amid lingering concerns about its corporate governance. The Adani Group flew the bankers to Mundra port in Guiarat to showcase the infrastructure of India's largest private port and elaborate on the conglomerate's strong financial conditions and expansion plans, said. The trip marks Adani Group's latest effort to reassure markets after months of damage US control following short-seller Hindenburg Research's which alleged corporate malfeasance claims the conglomerate has strongly denied. It is also an indication that the conglomerate is trying to diversify its funding channels by tapping the local capital market. It shows Adani's attempt to drive home the view that the Hindenburg attack is a thing of the past and that the priority now is building trust with and confidence among domestic investment banks.

In his Independence Day speech, PM Modi announces 'Vishwakarma scheme' from September

10th consecutive Durina Independence Day address, Prime Minister Narendra Modi unveiled the Vishwakarma Yojana, set to launch next month with an initial outlay of Rs 13,000 to 15,000 crore. The scheme, introduced in the 2023 Budget, aims to enhance the quality, scale, and global integration of products by artisans and craftspeople. Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Communities, women, transgender, and weaker sections will benefit from economic empowerment. The launch is planned for September 17, 2023, on Vishwakarma Jayanti. PM Modi also lauded women's contributions to national development and thanked farmers for advancing the agricultural sector during his Red Fort address.

Cabinet approves outlay of Rs 14,903 crore to expand Digital India programme

The Indian Union Cabinet has greenlit a 5-year extension of the Digital India initiative, allocating Rs 14,903 crore from FY2021-22 to FY2025-26. Notably. cybersecurity will be a prime focus, the Indian Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT-In). The expansion aims to upskill 5.25 lakh IT professionals, train 2.65 lakh individuals in cybersecurity, and add 540 services to the Umang app. Funds will support 1,200 startups in smaller cities, promote cybersecurity awareness among 12 crore people, and extend the DigiLocker platform to MSMEs. The plan also entails nine new supercomputers, plus three Alfocused centers of excellence for key sectors. As part of the National Supercomputing Mission, nine new supercomputers will be added, over the 18 supercomputers that are currently deployed.



Kushal Konwar

(21 March 1905 - 15 June 1943)

BHARAT: CHRONICLE OF SACRIFICE AND GLORY

Kushal Konwar was born on March 21 1905, at Chaodang Chariali of Ghiladhari Mouza, Golaghat district (then part of Shivsagar district) of Assam. His family descended from the royal family of the Ahom kingdom and used the surname "Konwar", which means Prince.

On Mahatma Gandhi's call, many people of Assam spontaneously joined the historical movement of 1942. Two of the leaders of Assam, Bharat Ratna Gopinath Bordoloi and Siddhinath Sarma, were arrested by the British in Dhubri while returning from Bombay after attending the Congress Working Committee meeting.

On October 10, 1942, hidden in the thick fog of early morning, Indian independence activists removed sleepers from a railway line near Sarupathar in the Golaghat district. A military train passing by derailed, and over a hundred British soldiers were killed. The police immediately cordoned the area and started an operation to catch the freedom fighters. The district magistrate of Jorhat, C.A. Humphrey, issued arrest warrants to all the freedom fighters of the Golaghat district. Accusing Kushal Konwar as the chief conspirator of the train sabotage, the police arrested him. He was brought from Golaghat and was lodged in the Jorhat jail on November 5, 1942.

The Court of CM Humphrey, Kushal Konwar, was declared guilty, though there was not a single proof against him. At dawn on June 15, 1943, at 4:30 am, Kushal Konwar was hanged in Jorhat Jail. He sacrificed his life for the freedom of India.
