Air Force chief receives first of 56 C-295 transport aircraft in Spain

Airbus Defence and Space has delivered the first of 56 C295 transport aircraft to the Indian Air Force as part of a Rs 21,935-crore project aimed at modernizing India's air assets. Chief of Air Staff Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhari received the aircraft in Seville, Spain. Airbus will deliver the first 16 aircraft from its Seville assembly line by 2025, with the subsequent 40 to be manufactured and assembled by Tata Advanced Systems (TASL) in India. The C295 is replacing India's aging Avro-748 planes and is known for its versatility in troop transport, paratrooper drops, logistics, medical evacuation, and missions. With immediate skilled jobs and 10,000 indirect jobs over the next decade, the C295 programme is a major boost for India's aerospace ecosystem, but the optimal absorption and channeling of offset billions will be crucial to the big picture success of the programme.

Aditya L1 successfully undergoes fourth earthbound manoeuvre

India's Aditya-L1 spacecraft, country's first mission to study the Sun, successfully completed its fourth earthbound maneuver, according to ISRO. This maneuver occurred as part of the spacecraft's 16-day journey around Earth, enabling it to gain the necessary velocity for its journey to the first Sun-Earth Lagrangian point (L1), located about 1.5 million km from Earth. The spacecraft is now in a new orbit at 256 km x 121,973 km. The next step is the Trans-Lagrangean Point 1 Insertion maneuver scheduled for September 19.

New 20% TCS rule from October 1, 2023 - Know TCS rates on international trips, forex & card payments, foreign investments

Starting from October 1, 2023, India will implement new tax collection at source (TCS) rates on various transactions. outward Overseas remittances exceeding Rs 7 lakh for purposes other than medical and educational will incur For TCS. educational remittances, TCS will be 0.5% if funded by an approved loan, or 5% otherwise. Medical expenses abroad will have a 5% TCS beyond the Rs 7 lakh threshold. Purchases of overseas tour packages up to Rs 7 lakh will be taxed at 5%, increasing to 20% beyond that amount. Foreign investments over Rs 7 lakh will incur a 20% TCS. Credit card transactions are exempt, but debit and forex card payments exceeding Rs 7 lakh will be subject to a 20% TCS. Multiple sources of forex payments will not change the Rs 7 lakh threshold for TCS.

India to take call on its policy stance on crypto, says DEA Secy

India is poised to determine its stance on cryptocurrency regulation in the coming months following consultations and endorsement for а regulatory framework for cryptocurrencies under the G20. Economic Affairs Secretary Ajay Seth emphasized the need to assess India's position with reference to the G20 framework, recognizing the importance of a global consensus. While there's an acknowledgment of risks, the discussion is moving toward regulation rather than an outright ban, aligning with the recent IMF and FSB policy recommendations. Specific Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said that the report released by the IMF and FSB will be discussed further by members during the World Bank Group-IMF Annual Meeting in October, to draw out specific contours for a global framework. She, however, refused to comment on whether that could involve a regulatory framework or an outright ban.

The Ministry of Home Affairs (IAST: Grha Mamtralaya), or simply the Home Ministry, is a ministry of the Government of India. It is mainly responsible for the maintenance of internal security and domestic policy. It is headed by Minister of Home Affairs.

The Ministry of Home Affairs is also the cadre controlling authority for the Indian Police Service (IPS), DANIPS and DANICS. Police-I Division of the ministry is the cadre controlling authority in respect of the Indian Police Service; whereas, the UT Division is the administrative division for DANIPS.

The Home Secretary (IAST: Griha Sachiva गृह सचिव) is the administrative head of the Ministry of Home Affairs. This post is held by a very senior IAS officer of the rank of Secretary to Government of India. The current Home Secretary is Ajay Kumar Bhalla, IAS and Secretary Is Chandu Burusu, IAS. All Central Armed Police Forces such as the CRPF, CISF, BSF, etc. and the Union territory police forces are under the control of the Union Home Ministry. The Union Home Secretary is the Chief Advisor to Union Home Minister on all matters such as policy formation, etc. The Post of Union Home Secretary is equivalent to the Chief Secretary of a State.
