State can't seize all private Jet Airways liquidation: Story **Supreme Court**

A landmark decision, the Supreme Court ruled on Tuesday that government cannot take control of all private properties for distribution to the public. This 7-2 majority ruling clarifies that while states can acquire private land in specific situations, they lack the constitutional authority to seize all resources for the 'common good.'

The nine-judge bench, led by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud, overturned previous rulings, including one by justice Krishna Iyer, which suggested that Article 39(b) of the Constitution granted states sweeping powers to acquire private resources.

The crux of the case revolved around whether private properties fall under the definition of "material resources of the community" as stated in Article 39(b). This article mandates that the state should ensure "that the ownership and control of the material resources of the community are so distributed as best to subserve the common good".

The majority verdict, however, clarified that this article does not grant states unlimited power to seize private Justice BV Nagarathna property. presented a partially dissenting opinion, Justice Sudhanshu disagreed with the majority ruling entirely.

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Apple to start manufacturing iPhone 17 early in India, shift key production away from China

Apple to start manufacturing iPhone 17 early in India, shift key production away from China.

Apple beginning is early manufacturing of the iPhone 17 in India, a shift from its traditional practice of handling this phase in China. This move, revealed by analyst Ming-Chi Kuo, marks the start of the "New Production Introduction" (NPI) process for the standard iPhone 17 model, while higher-end variants like the Pro and Pro Max will still undergo NPI in China. This initiative is part of Apple's broader strategy to diversify supply chain and reduce dependence on China, with plans to 25% around of production to India.

India has emerged as a significant manufacturing base for Apple, evidenced by the export approximately \$6 billion worth of iPhones from the country in the past six months. The early NPI efforts for the iPhone 17 indicate Apple's meticulous preparation for a global launch, ensuring that all processes manufacturing are optimized.



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India, Australia review comprehensive strategic partnership at foreign ministers' meet

India and Australia reviewed their comprehensive strategic partnership on Tuesday as external affairs minister S Jaishankar and his Australian counterpart Penny Wong explored ways to deepen cooperation in key areas such as defence, security and trade.

Jaishankar and Wong participated in the Foreign Ministers' Framework Dialogue in Canberra a day after India opened its fourth consulate in the Australian city of Brisbane, marking the rapid development of bilateral alongside burgeoning collaboration between the two countries within the Quad framework. The bilateral comprehensive strategic partnership is growing steadily and this is reflected in "stronger political ties, robust defence & security cooperation, expanded trade, greater mobility and deeper educational linkages", Jaishankar said on X after the meeting.

The two sides also discussed their respective neighbourhoods, the Indo-Pacific, the conflicts in West Asia and Ukraine and the global strategic scenario, he said.
